Emergency! - If your loved one is a suicide risk or a threat to others

Psychiatric Emergency Screening Services (PESS) evaluate those who may pose a danger to themselves or others and who may require involuntary commitment to mental health inpatient care. Call PESS if you or a loved one is experiencing acute symptoms of mental illness. Call for evaluation for intervention or inpatient treatment. Emphasis is on stabilization. You may go to Somerset Hospital emergency room at any time without an appointment. However, if you are able, it is best to call ahead.

The Psychiatric Emergency Screening Services program (PESS) provides crisis intervention services for residents, including screening for voluntary and involuntary hospitalization, mobile outreach, linkage to appropriate community resources, information and referrals. Counseling, emergency psychiatric evaluations and consultation services also are available.

The hotline (908-526-4100), answered by Crisis Intervention Specialists or Certified Screeners, is used to de-escalate a crisis situation that demands immediate intervention.

Note: There's a "new" option where after evaluation, PESS may be able to send someone to the home without police to talk to the person and evaluate the situation (within same day if possible).

What you need to tell PESS in an emergency

The screener will ask questions like the following. Your honest answers are crucial:

- 1. Why are you calling? What is happening?
- 2. What behaviors or statements have been made?
- 3. Does the person have any history of mental illness? What is the current treatment or medications?
- 4. Is the person suicidal, homicidal or shown destructive behavior in the past?
- 5. History/present use of substances (alcohol or drugs)?
- 6. Present access or possession of weapons or self-defense training?
- 7. Any medical problems?

Remember:

If you are frightened or concerned about being hurt, or have been hurt, or are afraid your loved one is hurting him or herself

- 1. <u>Psychiatric Emergency Screening Services</u> provide evaluation of those who may pose a danger to themselves or others and who may require involuntary commitment to mental health inpatient care. See also pages 1-2.
- 2. <u>National Suicide Prevention Lifeline</u> provides free and confidential emotional support to people in suicidal crisis or emotional distress 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. <u>Contact We Care</u> is responder for National Suicide Prevention Lifeline in northern and central NJ. Can text.
- 3. <u>NJ Hope Line (suicide prevention)</u>: Need someone to talk to? We are here to help. Our specialists are available for confidential telephone counseling and support 24 hours a day, 7 day per week.
- 4. <u>NJ Drug Abuse Hotline</u> provides trained clinically supervised telephone specialists who are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to educate, assist, interview and/or refer individuals and families battling addictions. Calls are free and information shared is confidential.
- 5. <u>Substance Abuse and Mental Services National Helpline</u> is a confidential, free, 24-hour-a-day, 365-day-a-year, information service, in English and Spanish, for individuals and family members facing substance abuse and mental health issues. This service provides referrals to local treatment facilities, support groups, and community-based organizations. The service is open 24/7, 365 days a year.

- 1. <u>PESS</u> provides evaluation of those who may pose a danger to themselves or others and may require involuntary commitment to mental health inpatient care. See also page 1-2.
- 2. Richard Hall Community Mental Health Center is a comprehensive mental health center dedicated to the prevention, early detection and treatment of emotional illness. The Psychosocial Rehabilitation Services Department assists people with persistent mental health issues to integrate into valued roles and resume functioning within the community. The departments offer services to individuals who need short term assistance due to life changes and transitions, intensive services to avoid re-hospitalization or homelessness, or help returning to work or other meaningful community roles. Programs include partial care, supported employment, case management.
- 3. <u>Somerset County Mental Health Board</u> serves as an advisory board to the Board of Chosen Freeholders, and monitors the provision of a continuum of mental health services on behalf of Somerset county residents. Department of Human Service contacts are listed as well as a guide to mental health services in Somerset County.
- 4. <u>Intensive Family Support Services</u> support activities designed to improve the quality of life for families with a mentally ill relative. Services including psycho education workshops, individual family consultations, respite, family support groups, system advocacy, linkage and referral, and medication monitoring may be delivered in the family's home, at the agency, or at other sites in the community convenient to the family.

- 1. NJ MentalHealthCares is New Jersey's first comprehensive mental health information and referral helpline and website. It can provide information and make referral to many mental health services including: legal, housing, employment, rehabilitation, inpatient and outpatient, self-help. It provides: Trained mental health professionals to answer calls; Live coverage form 8 am to 8pm with after hours coverage, Complete up to date listing of NJ's public mental health services, Ability to answer Information and referral requests via telephone or e-mail., Follow-up to ensure callers are satisfied with the referred service, Ability to directly transfer calls to services while staff remain on the line to facilitate the transfer.
- 2. <u>Peer Recovery WarmLine (PRW)</u> is a peer-run service providing ongoing telephone support to mental health consumers as they work towards their recovery. All calls are answered by peers who are trained, supportive mental health consumers. PRW is live Monday to Friday, 8 am to 10 pm, Saturday and Sunday, 5 pm to 10 pm, and holidays, 3 pm to 10 pm.
- 3. New Jersey Self Help Clearing House: Contacts for several thousand of the mental health and addiction groups are provided in their database.
- 4. <u>Depression and Bipolar Support Alliance</u>. We are a <u>mood-disorder</u> self-help support group affiliated with the highly respected Depression and Bipolar Support Alliance. Somerset County meetings are at Richard Hall and at Carrier Clinic. See website for details.
- 5. <u>Division of Mental Health Services, State of New Jersey</u>: Mental Health Services work to promote opportunities for adults with mental illness to maximize their ability to: seek and obtain treatment, live, work, socialize, and learn in the least restrictive environment with the appropriate therapeutic support. Link is to Frequently Asked Questions.
- 6. <u>PLAN/NJ</u> assists in the future care planning of individuals with various mental health disabilities and mental health challenges in New Jersey by working directly with parents and family members to answer the question, "Who will care for my loved one when I am gone?"
- 7. **LSNWJ** provides free civil legal services to low-income people, seniors, and people living with HIV/AIDS.

<u>Somerset Medical Center</u> provides Partial Hospital and Intensive Outpatient services.

<u>GenPsych Bridgewater</u> site offers a comprehensive array of programs and services to individuals in need of psychiatric, substance abuse, or eating disorders treatment. We also offer a comprehensive adolescent program that provides the flexibility of treating teens with a variety of mental health issues including dual diagnosis, substance abuse, trauma, and eating disorders. The Bridgewater location is staffed with adult, adolescent, and child psychiatrists, advanced practice nurses, masters and doctorate level clinicians, licensed certified alcohol and drug counselors, and registered dieticians.
